

After much frantic telephoning, leaving messages etc, Baz gets back to me -at 2.00 in the morning! - asking "Okay, what's her tour manager's name so I can mention it at the door!! I tell him that Ellen - yes, Foley herself - is in complete control of the situation, and that he should just arrive early for informal intro's...suit and tie preferred! Naturally, Barry finds it hard to believe that the most tallented woman in the entire Northern hemisphere has the time to involve herself with the likes of little ol' him. 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ELLEN FOLEY AT THE BOTTOM LINE IN MANHATTAN *JOth AUGUST 1983

I wasn't there, but the club was very crowded and amongst the throng were some of Ellen's most loyal fans:

Tony Sbriglia-all the way from Buffalo
Kathy Katsidhe-from Stuyvesant Town, Manhattan
Barry K.Smith-from Merrick, N.Y.State
Amy O'shea-Bowie maniac. And since his recent Mad. Sq.
Gdn. shows-the most depressed person on the entire planet!

Let's hear from Amy:

Due to chaotic traffic conditions caused by the blackout, I was about ten minutes late for the start of the show. Yes, bloody hell! There were two or three songs that I missed and then (as best I can remember) "Boys In The Attic", "Johnny and Mary", "Another Breath", " ? ", "Nightling", "Read My Lips" "Come and Get These Memories" and as encore of two songs that I didn't know. (One went something like "You know I've been drinking..." a la Marlene D.) Anyway the crowd seemed to recognise the songs I didn't know so I than they must be from previous albums? Filen looked really great although I can't say I cared for her outfit too much. Se. are you waiting to hear what I thought of the show? Well. okay...I won't keep you in suppense...it was ready...It was very good. (Hah! surprised you there en') Sometimes during the show it was better than very good but overall it was very good. Her voice sounds just as good live as it does on record and it was a strong show. (The audience loved it and as far as I could tell the place was very crowded. Her band needs a bit of toning down though on some of the slower/quieter songs. (On yes blien also did "Night Out", and that was one when I thought the band were a little heavy handed. Anyway I'm very glad I went to see her — to be guite honest I didn't expect to like it as much as I did!

Let's hear from Kathy:

Thought I'd write and tell you about the terrific performance that Ellen Foley gave last night at the Bottom Line in N.Y., she was great; I ended up staying for both shows. Here's a run down of the songs (not really in order) "Run For My Life". "Let Me Be The One You Love", "Boys In The Attic", "Johnny and Mary", "Another Breath", "Night Out", "Torchlight", "Come and Get These Memories", "Nightline", "Read My Lips" (only at the 1st show), "We Belong To The Night", and two encores. a ballad that I'd never heard before and "Staggerlee". That makes 13 - guess that means Ellen's not superstitious. I'd say the highlights were a really rockin' version of "Boys", "Night Out" featuring some dramatic posturing by Foley during the guitar solo and a moving rendition of "Johnny and Mary" done sitting down - if you can believe it, and an especially beautiful ballad that I think was called either "Grief" or "Guilty".

Ellen maintained a high level of intensity and energy throughout both shows. Her voice sounded terrific. It was a very impressive performance, but then that's no surprise to us now, is it? Anyway it was a pleasure to finally see her in concert again.






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Monique Van Moer promo departement

I was hoping to include a World-wide record releases list for Foley's material in this issue...having written to 40 of CBS's offices scattered accross the globe. By now they should have had ample time to reply to my 'demands'. Funny things happen to people who upset me, but two people who'll escape unscathed are:
Monique Van Moer of the Promo Dept. of CBS Disques, Belgium... whose thoughtfully detailed listing is reproduced below, and Julian Shapiro of Press Dept. CBS International, New York City... who sent a selection of publicity photo's covering Ellen's 3 Lp's plus pix taken of Foley on her first trip to Europe, including the one overleaf. Nice work guys/gals...if only there were more of your sort CBS's credibility wouldn't be on the wane.







During the first week in August I stayed at the Cazemier residence in the beautiful town of Dronrijp in the northern part of Holland. I'd met the family a few weeks earlier in London and they invited me to stay with them. Apparently, they got the impression I wore a pin-stripe suit, spectacles, carried an umbrella and spoke with a plum in my mouth...that couldn't be further from the truth: Watch out for a 'debut' pic of me in the next issue of the Foley fanzine. I had a very nice stay, especially a visit to Amsterdam, where I put an end to a five-month long search for a Ronettes album. Infact, I got their Volumes 1&2 of Greatest Hits, The Crystals Greatest Hits and a very hard to get Darlene Love album. They were all imports from Britain, and had been deleted ages ago. I was more than surprised to see that Vini Poncia had written stuff with Phil Spector, including "(The Best Part Of) Breaking Up" for The Ronettes. Just before I compile each newsletter proper, I place a call to Ellen so various issues/points can be clarified. I 'phone her at home - on this occasion Friday evening 9th September - and I'm asked to call back in half an hour because she has to go and do her laundry before they shut her out: Tomorrow Ellen and the guys trek all the way to Cleveland...for one show...and a girl must have something clean to wear:

I duly call back and I'm greeted by the answer-phone; the message cut short by Ellen's return from the wash-house. The most talented, awe-inspiring woman in the entire Northern Hemisphere is tired ... having just staggered back to the sanctuary of her luxury apartment. "Jeez, this place is a mess. I've got all the bands equipment in the hallway." She'd been at rehearsal all day for an off-Broadway play called "Eve Is Innocent". The Cleveland gig will be the last for the time being. Ellen hopes to get back to her public in November when the play should have run it's course. Ellen even expressed a desire to "hitch onto a big tour"...like The Police? "Not that Big:" We didn't have much time to discuss the subject of of the play - Foley had to go collect her laundry - but it must be something to do with Adam and The-Ants Eve? Ellen did say that it involved some very heavy drama and that she was thrown in at the deep end. Core: This news bulletin is pretty snappy, en? Other topics briefly mentioned on the satellite link-up were, Randy Crawford's new UK single "Nightline", which surprised Foley...she didn't know who Randy was, not even that "Street Life" number of a few years back. Randy is a sweet lady, her producer is not so sweet: Funny how the backing vocals, especially on the intro' and fade out are exactly the same as Foley's version. (While we're on the subject; I now have a copy of the ever-so-hard-to-get remixes of "Nightline".) Also touched on were Will Powers and Lynn Goldsmith. When I told her that NME's Danny Baker gave "Kissing With Confidence" the thumbs-down and in the process got himself rather confused, she had a good laugh and said "Lynn Goldsmith is a great lady." We all know what she means: And Ellen was delighted that "Keep It Confidential" is now the A-side in Britain. It deserves to be a monster hit because it is the best Soul record this year, and I can say that without feeling my opinion may seem biased. Well, Ellen's got to rush back to the other side of superstardom, yes ... domesticity. Byeee.

Many hours after that call, it suddenly occurred to me that I have a duty to inform, and that my name would be nothing (it is actually) if I failed to deliver the goods, so to speak. All this is leading up to where you can see "Eve Is Innocent"...Circle Repertory Theatre at 99 Seventh Avenue nr Sheridan Sq. (212 691 3210). I got their number from a message on Foley's 'phone, so I called them and just assed for the theatres name, which I later checked up on in my "I Love New York" guide. I'm heading for N.Y.C. for Nov/December, when I might be lucky enough to catch Foley in concert. My friend Amy says she'll check out "Eve Is Innocent" for me and everyone else who can't be there. In return I'll mosey on down to the first World David Bowie Convention in London on October 1st & 2nd. Honestly, the things I'd do for a good review::


